He began his career as a cameraman/editor for CTV's regional network affiliate, ATV, which serves Canada's Maritime Provinces. Within 2 years he relocated to Toronto to join Radio Canada as a news/current affairs cameraman. In 1987 he moved to Ottawa and joined CBC's Flagship current affairs program, The Journal with Barbara Frum. There he has covered stories as varied as The Meech-Lake accord, the Oka Crisis, the Free Trade Agreement, the Montreal Poly-technique Massacre and Perestroika.

Leaving the CBC in 1992, Larry started Carey Productions and has since been shooting for national and international broadcasters, production houses, independent producers as well as corporations. With years of experience in documentary and reality-tv as well as corporate interviews/productions and commercial spots, he is comfortable, proficient and creative within all of them. He has also directed and produced educational as well as arts programming.
